INTRODUCTION

This Handbook contains the selection policies which the Canadian Fencing Federation (CFF) will use to select the athletes who will represent Canada at the 2016 Junior and Cadet World Championships as well as at other Junior HPP projects during the 2015-16 season. This information will allow athletes and their coaches to develop their annual training and competition plans for the season.

While every effort has been made to ensure the accuracy of the material contained within this Handbook, readers are advised to consult with the person in charge of the HP program or the Junior National Coaches (JNC's) if they have questions about any element contained within.

Similarly, the dates of international selection competitions are accurate as of the date of publication of this Handbook, but dates and events can and do change. Please verify competition details before making final travel arrangements. Furthermore, it is the athlete's (and their personal coaches') responsibility to be familiar with the information found in this document.

CHANGES TO THIS HANDBOOK

The CFF has taken every possible step to ensure that the material in this Handbook will remain accurate for the entire season, but in instances where changes do occur, specifically to international selection competitions, the person in charge of the HP program (in consultation with the High Performance Advisory Committee (HPAC)) reserves the right to make changes to this Handbook, which in its discretion are necessary to ensure the selection of the best teams for the 2015-2016 season events.

Any changes to this Handbook shall be communicated directly to all High Performance Program members. This clause shall not be used to justify changes after a competition or trials, which formed part of the internal nomination procedure unless it is related to an unforeseen circumstance.

The purpose of this section is to allow for changes to this Handbook that may become necessary due to a typographical error or a lack of clarity in a definition or wording before it has an impact on athletes. The purpose of such changes must be in order to avoid disputes over the meaning of the provisions of this Handbook rather than to allow changes to be made to justify selection of different athletes than would have otherwise been selected.

All changes must be reasonably justifiable in accordance with fundamental principles of natural justice and procedural fairness.

HIGH PERFORMANCE SELECTION RATIFICATION COMMITTEE

The High Performance Selection Ratification Committee will ratify the final selections. They will ensure that the final team composition proposed by the national coaches for all major Championships meets the criteria published in this Handbook. The HPSRC for each weapon will consist of:

1. the High Performance Manager (HPM);
2. two (2) or three (3) members of the High Performance Advisory Committee.

The HPSRC reserves the right to withdraw an athlete from a selection in the following cases:

1. If the athlete has not taken part in a mandatory training camps as described for the HPP prior to the event. Exemptions can be requested in advance of a specific event. Exemptions will be granted on a case by case basis once discussed between the HPM and JNC's.
2. If the athlete has not fulfilled his/her responsibilities as identified in the "HPP Athlete Agreement".
3. If the athlete has not fulfilled his/her responsibilities as identified in the "CFF Code of Conduct".
4. If the athlete has outstanding debts with the CFF.

CFF SELECTION POLICIES

NOTE: In the event of a dispute over a selection, athletes can find the *CFF Policy of Selection Appeals* on the CFF website.

a) Eligibility for Selections

To be eligible for selection for any FIE competition or National Team Project (NTP), a fencer must:

1. have a validated 2015-2016 CFF license;
2. have a 2015-2016 FIE license for Canada;
3. be a Canadian Citizen; and
4. meet any published selection criteria for the respective competition.

Please see the CFF website to purchase an FIE license.

b) North America Cups (NAC's) and non FIE International Competitions

North American Cups

Selection: Open to any Canadian athlete with a CFF license.

NACs organized by the United State Fencing Association (USFA), will often be designated as International selection competitions for the Cadet and Junior HPP Selection Rankings.

There are currently no Selection Criteria to compete in Cadet and Junior NACs. The USFA however, may impose minimum standards moving forward and the CFF may need to adjust its selection events accordingly if needed.

The USFA does impose a minimum standard for DIV I NACs. They require that a fencer have a "C" rating or higher to register.

Fencers are responsible for their own registration and travel arrangements to these competitions. Before booking flights for NAC events, please confirm all dates, locations and registration deadlines on the USFA web site <http://www.usfencing.org>

Developmental Competitions: European Circuit (Cadet-Junior)

There is another group of competitions in Europe, which also provide an important developmental opportunity for Cadets and Juniors. Due to their format (poules and Direct Elimination (DE) with repechage) and size they are a much better developmental opportunity than a Junior FIE A. They are a great first contact with the International scene. Information on these circuits can be found at:

Personal/Provincial Coaches are encouraged to plan a club/provincial team trip to one of the Cadet or Junior competitions held in these countries as a developmental tour (competition and training in clubs). In some cases it may be more beneficial for several clubs and/or provinces to get together to resource such a project. The HP staff can assist in identifying and establishing contacts for such a project.

A maximum of two European Cadet Circuit competitions will be identified as Cadet National Team Projects (NTP) and used as selection events for the 2015-2016 season. Athletes are encouraged to enter additional European Cadet Circuit competitions for experience, but only the ones identified by the CFF will be used for selection. A specific European License is required to participate in the European Cadet Circuit and can be purchased through the CFF website.

The CFF does not coordinate arrangements for NAC's or non FIE competitions. Fencers are responsible for their own registration and travel arrangements to these competitions. Please confirm all dates, locations and registration deadlines on the respective websites before booking flights:

NAC – USFA: www.usfencing.org

French Circuit – FFE: www.escrime-ffe.fr

German Circuit – DFB: www.fechten.org

The organizers may impose additional qualification standards for participation (i.e. FIE license in France or Germany, USFA-C classification for NAC's, etc.). All athletes should verify with the organizers whether they are eligible to compete prior to making travel arrangements. Some additional work with the National Coaches may be required to ensure all standards are met to the satisfaction of the organizers. A long lead-up time to these events is strongly recommended.

Minor athletes participating in any of these events must be accompanied by an adult (parent, personal coach or other guardian as outlined in a letter sent to the CFF).

Entry Limitations: CFF will select a maximum of 12 fencers for any European Circuit that is identified as an NTP. Depending on number athletes who attend, a referee levy may be charged to the athletes. A maximum of 4 fencers will be selected for all other European Cadet Circuit events.

Selection Process for NTP's: The national coach for the respective weapon, will make all selections for the NTP's using the following criteria:

1. CFF will select a maximum of 12 fencers for any European Circuit that is identified as an NTP.
2. Athletes who competed at the 2015 Senior World Championships will be automatically selected for the NTP. All remaining positions will be prioritized according to the Cadet HPP rankings with the NC having final approval.
3. The 35 day deadline for application may be waived for NTP selection.



-
4. If an alternate is selected to replace an athlete who cannot participate in the event, the alternate can earn HPP points towards selection for Junior Pan Am Championships or World Championships.

c) Junior World Cups

A maximum of two Junior World Cup events will be identified as Junior National Team Projects (NTP) and used as selection events for the 2015-2016 season. Athletes are encouraged to enter additional Junior World Cups for experience and to improve their FIE ranking, but only the two identified by the CFF will be used for selection.

Only the CFF can register fencers for FIE competitions. Consequently, all requests for registration for FIE competitions must be made as indicated in the sections below.

Minimum Qualification Standard: To be eligible to compete in an FIE competition held outside of Canada, a fencer must have a valid FIE and CFF license for the current season.

Registration deadline: 35 days (5 weeks) before the first day of competition of any FIE competition. This deadline will be waived for National Team Projects if selection occurs after the 35 day deadline.

Entry Procedures: To request participation in an international event each athlete must complete the online request process on the CFF website found under the High Performance tab. Submission does not guarantee fencers a spot in the competition. If a fencer is not selected, the request fee (if applicable) will be refunded to the fencer.

Late entries: Will not be accepted.

Entry Limitations: CFF will select a maximum of 12 fencers for any Junior World Cup that is identified as an NTP. Depending on number athletes who attend, a referee levy may be charged to the athletes. A maximum of 4 fencers will be selected for all other Junior World Cups.

Final Entry Selection: Within five (5) business days after the deadline, the list of selected fencers for the competition will be finalized. The list of selected fencer will be compiled as follows:

- Applications will be prioritized according to the Junior HPP rankings with the national coach and HPAC having final approval.

Results that change the point standings between the selection date and the competition have no bearing on the selection. The list is then emailed out to all fencers (and their personal coaches) who have submitted the entry Form to the e-mails provided on the Form and to the pertinent national coaches.



Team Event: All fencers selected for a Junior World Cup NTP must be prepared to participate in the team event. FIE team event fees must be paid by the participating fencers.

Confirmation of Attendance at International Competition: Fencers are required to confirm their participation in the NTP Junior World Cup by replying to the selection email sent to all fencers within 72 hours. If a reply is not received within this timeframe it will be taken as a refusal of selection.

Withdrawals from an FIE Competition: Withdrawals must be received by the CFF by e-mail at hppc@fencing.ca, at least 14 days prior to the first day of the competition. Voice mail is not acceptable. Fencers withdrawing after the deadline or who do not show up at the competition will be fined **\$1,500.00 and will be suspended from any future International selections until the fine is paid**. This is a fine assessed by the FIE to the CFF and it will be passed on to the athlete at fault. Exception to this fine will be considered if the fencer is withdrawing due to a “force majeure” situation such as an injury or illness, which prevents the fencer from competing. Medical documentation from a doctor must accompany the withdrawal notice, which must be sent by e-mailed with the withdrawal request **before** the scheduled competition.

Notification

Following confirmation of participation, the final list is e-mailed to all fencers, their personal coaches and to the pertinent national coaches.

Minor athletes participating in any of these events must be accompanied by an adult (parent, personal coach or other guardian as outlined in a letter sent to the CFF).

Athletes should not make any travel arrangements until they have received an e-mail confirming that they are registered.

Selection Process and Criteria for NTP's: The national coach for the respective weapon, will make all selections for the NTP's using the following criteria:

1. CFF will select a maximum of 12 fencers for any Junior World Cup that is identified as an NTP.
2. Athletes who competed at the 2015 Senior World Championships will be automatically selected for the NTP. All remaining positions will be prioritized according to the Junior HPP rankings with the national coach and HPAC having final approval.
3. The 35 day deadline for application may be waived for NTP selection.
4. If an alternate is selected to replace an athlete who cannot participate in the event, the alternate can earn points towards selection for Junior Pan Am Championships or World Championships.

NOTES



-
- Carded athletes, are reminded that they are required to take part in all NTP's (for which they are selected) in their entirety. Failure to do so could result in the national coach recommending that the athlete be removed from the HPP and carding be revoked.
 - All athletes selected for a Junior World Cup NTP must be prepared to participate in the Team event.

HIGH PERFORMANCE PROGRAM SELECTION RANKINGS

Overview

The HPP Selection Rankings are used to identify athletes for International selections, CFF funding opportunities and as one of the selection criteria to nominate and prioritize athletes for the AAP.

Athletes will be ranked by the point total that they have achieved in the designated selection competitions. The HPP Selection Ranking will be reset at zero at the beginning of each season.

Athletes will be ranked by the point total of the competitions in Chart 1, with a maximum of 12 athletes named to the Cadet or Junior Squad for the designated European Cadet Circuit or Junior World Cup. Athletes who competed at the 2015 Senior World Championships will automatically be named to the Cadet or Junior Squad. The remainder of the places on the Cadet and Junior Squads for the designated European Cadet Circuit or Junior World Cup will be filled based on the cadet or junior selection rankings up to a maximum of 12.

The Cadet and Junior Squads will be selected after the last HPP competition.

Tie-Breaking

Should two (2) or more fencers be tied with the same point total, the tie will be broken as follows:

1. by the point total of the designated NAC events in the respective HP Selection Rankings for selection to the Cadet or Junior Squad;

Should a tie still exist, the tie will be broken:

2. by the best result (placing) at a designated NAC event.

Selection Criteria

In each weapon the selection will be made as follows:

Cadet Individual Selection (4 athletes)

- Any athlete who, on the selection date, is ranked first, second, third, and fourth on the CFE Cadet HP Selection Rankings will be selected for the Individual Event in that weapon, provided they have been accepted to the HPP by **December 8, 2015**.
- Only the top 4 athletes who make the Individual Selection can earn points. If an alternate is selected to replace an athlete who cannot participate in the event, the alternate will participate and can earn points towards selection for World Championships.

Junior Individual and Team Selection (4 athletes)

- Any athlete who competed at the 2015 Senior World Championships, made the round of 64, and finished in the top half at the 2015 Senior World Championships, will automatically be



selected for the 2016 Junior Pan Am Championships, provided they continue to follow the national coach approved training and competition plan

- Remaining spots will be filled by the highest ranked juniors on the CFF Junior HP Selection Rankings for the Individual and Team Events in that weapon, provided they have applied to the HPP by **December 8, 2015**.
- If an alternate is selected to replace an athlete who cannot participate in the event, the alternate can earn points towards selection for World Championships.

Tie-Breaking

Should two (2) or more fencers be tied with the same point total, the tie will be broken by the best result of the designated European Cadet Circuit competition (cadets) or Junior World Cup (juniors).

NOTE

Selections are conditional on the selected athlete following their national coach approved training and competition plan, regularly submitting training progress reports in accordance with national coach guidelines, and taking part in any pre-Junior Pan-American Championships mandatory training camps prior to the event. Exemptions can be requested in advance of a specific event. Exemptions will be granted on a case-by-case basis once discussed between the HPM and the Junior National Coaches.

Confirmation of attendance to the Cadet/Junior Pan-American Championships and Cadet/Junior World Championships

Fencers are required to confirm their participation in the Cadet & Junior Pan-American Championships by replying to the selection e-mail sent to all fencers within 72 hours. If a reply is not received in this timeframe, it will be taken as a refusal of selection. If an athlete accepts their Cadet/Junior Pan Am Championships selection, they also agree to attend Cadet/Junior World Championships should they qualify for the event.

Notification

Following confirmations of participation, the final list is e-mailed to all fencers, their personal coaches and to the pertinent national coaches.

Selection Criteria



In each weapon the selection will be made as follows:

Junior

Individual Selection (4 athletes)

- Athlete competed at the 2016 Junior Pan Am Championship (unless exemption granted by national coach).
- Any athlete who competed at the 2015 Senior World Championships, made top 64, and finished in the top half at the 2015 Senior World Championships, will automatically be selected for the 2016 Junior World Championships, provided they continue to follow the national coach approved training and competition plan
- Remaining athletes will be selected for the individual event based on the Junior HPP rankings provided they have achieved one of the following results during the selection period:
 - a. Achieved the minimum criteria to qualify for the 2016 senior world championships;
 - b. a top 32 at the designated Junior World Cup (must be in top 50%);
 - c. a top 32 at the designated Junior NAC (must be in top 50%);
 - d. a top 32 at the designated Division 1 NAC (must be in top 50%); or
 - e. a top 8 result at the 2016 Junior Pan-American Championships (must be in top 50%);

NOTES:

- 1) Athletes must be promoted from the pool round in order to meet the criteria.**
- 2) Must have applied to the HPP by December 8, 2015.**
- 3) Under special circumstances the HPAC may waive a criterion in order to complete a team or give experience to a promising fencer based on the national coach's recommendation.**

Team Selection (4 athletes)

- Any athlete selected for the junior individual event will be selected for the Team Event in that weapon. Should fewer than three athletes be selected for the junior event, the top-ranked cadet athlete(s) in the CFF Cadet HPP ranking who has met the minimum criteria for Cadet World Championships will be selected for the Team Event. Athletes who accept their junior selection must participate in both individual and team events.

Cadet

Individual Selection (3 athletes)



-
- Any athlete who, on the selection date, has qualified for an Individual event at the Junior World Championships, will automatically be selected for the Individual event in that weapon at the Cadet World Championships.
 - Athlete competed at the 2016 Cadet Pan Am Championship (unless exemption granted by national coach).
 - Any athlete who, on the selection date, is ranked first, second, and third (if a spot is still available) on the CFF Cadet HP Selection Rankings will be selected for the Individual Event in that weapon provided they have achieved one of the following results during the selection period:
 - a. Achieved the minimum criteria to qualify for the 2016 junior world championships;
 - b. Achieved the minimum criteria to qualify for the 2016 senior world championships;
 - c. a top 32 at a European Cadet Circuit event (must be in top 50% and only designated European Cadet events qualify for selection points however)
 - d. a top 32 at the designated Cadet NAC (must be in top 50%) or;
 - e. a top 8 result at the 2016 Cadet Pan-American Championships.

NOTES:

1) Athletes must be promoted from the pool round in order to meet the criteria.

2) Must have applied to the HPP by December 8, 2015.

3) Under special circumstances the HPAC may waive a criterion in order to complete a team or give experience to a promising fencer based on the national coach's recommendation.

Team (6 athletes – 1 per weapon)

Athletes ranked 1st in the cadet HPP ranking will be selected for the cadet mixed team event.

Tie-Breaking

Should two (2) or more fencers be tied with the same point total, the tie will be broken as follows:

1. by the combined point total of the designated international selection competitions (European Cadet Circuit plus Cadet Pan-Ams for cadets or Junior World Cup plus Junior Pan-Ams for juniors);

Should a tie still exist, the tie will be broken:

2. by the best result at Cadet Pan-Ams for cadets or Junior Pan-Ams for juniors.

NOTE



All selections are conditional on the selected athlete following their Junior National Coach approved training and competition plan, regularly submitting training progress reports in accordance with National Coach guidelines, and taking part in any mandatory pre-Cadet/Junior World Championships training camps prior to the event. Exemptions can be requested in advance of a specific event. Exemptions will be granted on a case-by-case basis once discussed between the HPM and the NC's.

Confirmation of attendance to the Junior World Championships and Junior Pan Am

Fencers are required to confirm their participation in the Junior World Championships by replying to the selection e-mail sent to all fencers within 72 hours. If a reply is not received in this timeframe, it will be taken as a refusal of selection.

Notification

Following confirmations of participation, the final list is e-mailed to all fencers, their personal coaches and to the pertinent NC's.
