


### 2024/25 Operational Plan

# CANADIAN FENCING FEDERATION FÉDÉRATION CANADIENNE D'ESCRIME





- The women's foil team won gold at Pan-Am Championships, was 8<sup>th</sup> at World Championships and is currently ranked #5 in the world.
- Jessica Guo is the 2024 Junior World Champion. She has also won 2 medals at senior world cups this season.
- 16 year old Angel Xiao won bronze at a senior world cup this season.
- Our teams brought home 12 medals from Pan-Am Games including 2 gold.
- Canada had a best-ever result at the 2024 Cadet/Junior World Championships, winning 4 medals and finishing 6<sup>th</sup> overall in the medal count.
- Canada has qualified 3 teams and 2 individuals to the Paris Olympics, a record number since a qualification system was established.
- Canada has qualified 1 athlete for the Paralympics, with another 1-2 in contention.

#### **2024-2025 Fiscal Year**

### Update Since the Last Plan: Re-Prioritization of Commitments in lieu of new drivers & insights.

- Since this document's last iteration, a number of events have led the CFF to rethink and reprioritize the commitments comprising its Operational Plan:
  - As a result of conservative budgeting, national competitions earning profits, and maintaining staffing levels at a minimum, the CFF has been able to allocate resources to assist our athletes in qualifying and preparing for Paris 2024 and begin to build a reserve fund for future contingencies.
  - The CFF BoD has not yet revisited the current Strategic Plan but intends to do so this fiscal year.
  - In order to maintain support for our programs, the CFF continues to operate with a minimum staff including a full-time Executive Director, a part-time High Performance Director, a part-time HP & Membership Services Coordinator, and national coaches that receive honoraria for their work.
  - The CFF was able to run 3 national competitions in 2023-2024, with each event earning a profit.
  - Membership has now exceeded pre-pandemic numbers.

### Objective #10: Increase revenue opportunities through event hosting

Item Status Since the Last Update	<ul> <li>Three national competitions were held in 2023-2024</li> <li>Expenses increased due increased cost of airfare, hotels, and shipping of equipment</li> <li>The receipt of hosting grants for two national competitions assisted in ensuring a profitable event</li> <li>A new national event funding model was approved</li> </ul>
Targeted Activities for 2024/25	<ul> <li>Review lessons learned from this season and retain practices that will allow for continued profitable events in the future</li> <li>Continue to host two national events in the central region to ensure greater participation, increased revenue, and reduced travel expenses for officials</li> <li>Add one additional national competition as a trial</li> <li>Assess feasibility of including additional age categories at certain competitions as a means to increase participation</li> </ul>
Execution Interdependencies	<ul> <li>This is contingent upon the CFF's ability to identify provincial/club partners to host national events during the Fiscal Year</li> </ul>
KPIs	<ul> <li>All events hosted by CFF are revenue positive</li> <li>Participation levels at national events are similar to, or greater than those of past years.</li> </ul>



#### Objective #11: Increase online sales opportunities

Targeted Activities for 2024/25	<ul> <li>Evaluate relationship with new provider</li> <li>Research alternate options for providing apparel for NT programs and operating the online shop</li> </ul>
Execution Interdependencies	This success of the online shop is contingent upon establishing an agreement with a new partner
KPIs	Sign agreement with a new apparel partner that will also operate the online shop

Execution Interdependencies	This is contingent upon contractor availability and the volunteer effort of the Governance Committee and Board of Directors
KPIs	Implement necessary actions to address areas where the CFF does not currently meet the Sport Governance Code

Targeted Activities for 2024/25	<ul> <li>Continued tracking of Safe Sport requirements in membership system</li> <li>Enforce/monitor completion of mandatory training and background checks by all stakeholders</li> <li>Promote Abuse Free Sport and OSIC to our participants</li> <li>Continue to work with PSOs to ensure alignment of safe sport policies</li> </ul>
Execution Interdependencies	This is contingent upon continued ability to use the membership system to track requirements and staff workload
KPIs	<ul> <li>All stakeholders to have met mandatory Safe Sport requirements</li> <li>All NT athletes and staff to complete training prior to participating in NT activities</li> <li>Enforcement of Safe Sport training requirements at national events</li> </ul>

Targeted Activities for 2024/25	<ul> <li>Implement/oversee completion of specific gender equity initiatives to include:         <ul> <li>Provide further opportunities for women coaches to work with the National Teams</li> <li>Continue to provide mentorship opportunities for new or less experienced women coaches</li> <li>Provide opportunities for women officials to work at national events</li> <li>Maintain social media efforts to promote women in fencing</li> </ul> </li> </ul>
Execution Interdependencies	Continued progress towards completion of some initiatives are dependent upon Sport Canada gender equity funding
KPIs	<ul> <li>4-6 women selected to work as officials at each national event</li> <li>Social media coordinator remaining in place for 2024-25</li> </ul>



#### Objective #16: Olympic & Paralympic Qualification

<b>Key Parameters</b>	Discussion
Item Status Since the Last Update	<ul> <li>3 teams and 2 individuals have qualified for the Paris Olympics.</li> <li>2-3 athletes are currently in contention for Paralympic qualification</li> <li>A coach was provided to support the teams at the qualification competitions</li> </ul>
Targeted Activities for 2024/25	Provide support to the teams & individuals qualified for Paris 2024 to ensure optimal preparation
Execution Interdependencies	This is contingent upon sufficient funding being available to support High Performance
KPIs	Funding is provided to the teams and individuals qualified for Paris 2024 to enable them to attend preparation camps.
