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1. INTRODUCTION

This Handbook contains the selection policies which the Canadian Fencing Federation (CFF) will use to select the athletes who will represent Canada at the 2027 World Championships, 2027 Pan American Zonal Championships, and other Senior international events during the 2026-27 season. This information will allow athletes and their coaches to develop their annual training and competition plans for this season.

While every effort has been made to ensure the accuracy of the material contained within this Handbook, readers are advised to consult with the CFF High Performance Director (hpd@fencing.ca) if they have questions about any element contained within this Handbook.

Similarly, the dates of international selection competitions are accurate as of the date of publication of this Handbook; however, dates and events can and do change. Please verify competition details before making final travel arrangements. Furthermore, it is the athletes' (and their personal coaches') responsibility to be familiar with the information found in this document.

2. CHANGES TO THIS HANDBOOK

The CFF has taken every possible step to ensure that the material in this Handbook will remain accurate for the entire season, but in instances where changes do occur, particularly with respect to international selection competitions, the High Performance Director (HPD) in consultation with the High Performance Advisory Committee (HPAC) reserves the right to make changes to this Handbook, which in its discretion are necessary to ensure the selection of the best teams for each season's events.

Any changes to this Handbook shall be communicated directly to all High Performance Program members. This clause shall not be used to justify changes after a competition or trials that formed part of the internal nomination procedure, unless it is related to an unforeseen circumstance.

The purpose of this section is to allow for changes to this Handbook that may become necessary due to a typographical error or a lack of clarity in a definition or wording before such an issue has had an impact on athletes. The purpose of such changes must be to avoid disputes over the meaning of the provisions of this Handbook rather than to allow changes to be made to justify selection of different athletes than would have otherwise been selected.

All changes must be reasonably justifiable in accordance with fundamental principles of natural justice and procedural fairness.

2.1 REVISION AND AMENDMENTS

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3. HIGH-PERFORMANCE ADVISORY COMMITTEE (HPAC)



The High-Performance Advisory Committee will be consulted on the development and interpretation of the Selection Criteria and Booklet, and any subsequent changes to the Booklet. It will be comprised of the following members:

- The High-Performance Director (Chair).
- At least three National coaches (one per weapon).
- Athlete Representative
- One member representing the CFF Board of Directors.
- The CFF Executive Director.
- Any other additional member appointed by the High-Performance Director on an ad hoc basis, when considered relevant to a specific issue.

4. HIGH PERFORMANCE SELECTION PANEL (HPSP)

The High Performance Selection Panel will make the initial selections for all World Championships, Olympic Games, World University Games, Pan American Zonal Championships, and Pan American Games, and will be comprised of the following members:

- The High Performance Director (HPD) (Chair).
- The National coach (or designate) for the appropriate weapon.
- The Executive Director of the CFF.
- The President of the CFF or a representative of the CFF Board of Directors designated by the President of the CFF.
- One HPAC representative excluding the above-mentioned members.

5. WITHDRAWAL FROM SELECTION

The HPSP panel reserves the right to withdraw an athlete from selection in the following cases:

- If the athlete does not respect the yearly training and competition plan designated by the HPP. Exemptions can be requested in advance of a specific event. Exemptions will be granted on a case-by-case basis by the HPD in consultation with the National Coach.
- If the athlete fails to meet specific performance readiness criteria communicated by the National Coach in writing, such as mandatory meetings, engagement with IST, and respect for others.
- If the athlete has not fulfilled responsibilities in the “HPP Athlete Agreement”.
- If the athlete has outstanding debts with the CFF.
- To conform with a decision made by the appropriate disciplinary body concerning a code of conduct breach.



6. CONFLICTS OF INTEREST

In the event of a perceived conflict of interest (for instance, where an athlete under consideration for selection is a family member, personal student, or member of the same club as a panel member), the panel member will be substituted as follows

- The HPD will be replaced with someone appointed by the CFF Executive Director.
- The National coach will be replaced with someone appointed by the HPD.
- The CFF Executive Director will be replaced by someone appointed by the President.
- The President of the CFF will be replaced with another member of the Board appointed by the Board.

7. HIGH PERFORMANCE PROGRAM REQUIREMENTS

Athletes must be registered in the High Performance Program (HPP) to be eligible to be selected to participate in all international events (FIE Satellite events, World Cups, European Fencing Confederation competitions, Pan American and World Championships). This booklet outlines the policies and procedures for the following:

- Application to the High Performance Program (HPP).
- Selection of HP athletes to the National Teams for:
 - 2027 Cadet and Junior Pan American Zonal Championships.
 - 2027 Cadet and Junior World Championships.
- Selection of HP athletes for designated Cadet, Junior, and Senior World Cups.
- Selection of HP athletes for non-designated EFC competitions.
- Selection of HP athletes for non-designated Cadet, Junior and Senior World Cups.
- Selection of HP athletes for non-designated FIE Satellite events.

8. CITIZENSHIP REQUIREMENTS

Fencers must be Canadian citizens in possession of a valid Canadian passport and eligible to represent Canada by applicable selection deadlines to compete in any event requiring an FIE License (FIE Satellite World Cups, Senior World Cups, Cadet World Cups, Junior World Cups, Grand Prix event competitions), or to be selected for any World Championships, World University Games, Pan American Zonal Championships, Pan American Games, or Olympic or Paralympic Games. Permanent residents of Canada may register for EFC Cadet events. Permanent residents will be selected, according to HP rankings, after Canadian citizens.

8.1 CHANGE OF CITIZENSHIP REQUIREMENTS



Fencers wishing to change nationality for FIE registration purposes must first contact the High Performance Director in writing indicating the desire to change representation to or from Canada with an explanation of reasons and any supporting documentation. Rules regarding change of country affiliation are governed by the FIE (please see [FIE Administrative Rule 1.4](#) and [FIE Statute 9.2](#)).

9. APPLICATION TO THE HIGH PERFORMANCE PROGRAM (HPP)

To be eligible for the HPP, an athlete must:

- Hold a valid CFF license for the 2026-2027 season obtained from the provincial fencing association at [2026-27 CFF Memberships](#)
- Purchase a FIE license and/or an EFC license for the 2026-2027 season.
- Be a Canadian citizen or permanent resident;
- Complete the HPP application at <https://fencing.ca/hpp-application/>
- Complete the [SafeSport](#) online course required by Sport Canada AND
- Complete the [Sport Integrity Canada Safe Sport 2025](#) and sign the consent form.
- Have no outstanding debts with the CFF.

The CFF may reject an application to the HPP or suspend an athlete's HPP membership if there are adequate grounds to do so. Examples that may justify a rejection or suspension of HPP membership include, but are not limited to, outstanding financial debts owed to the CFF and any behaviour that violates the CFF Code of Conduct and Ethics. Any HP selection points earned during a suspension will not be awarded, even once the suspension is cleared.

REGULAR REGISTRATION: \$500.00 if paid on or before September 24th, 2026.

LATE REGISTRATION: \$650.00 if paid on or after September 25th, 2026.

NOTE: Only results from competitions that begin following the completion of the HPP application and payment will be included in the HPP Rankings. Results from competitions before a completed application will not appear in the HPP Rankings (e.g., an athlete who registers and pays the \$650 fee on January 1, 2027, may count results from competitions starting January 1, 2027). **EXCEPTION:** May 2026 National results will count for the 2027 Cadet and Junior HPP rankings for all athletes, regardless of when they register for the HPP. These results will be included in the rankings following completion of the HPP registration.

The CFF will provide HPP athletes with an official Fencing Canada tracksuit (new warmups will be issued every four (4) years), HP athletes are obliged to wear the official CFF warmups (both red top and the matching black bottoms) at international competitions, training camps, media events, and most importantly, on the podium. Athletes requiring or wishing a replacement tracksuit may purchase them from the CFF for \$200.

CFF Expectations of HP Athletes at International Competitions



The CFF values sport professionalism, teamwork, inclusion, dedication, and commitment from all staff, athletes, and volunteers. Based on these values we are clearly defining our expectations for all National team program members.

Athlete Support (Individual and Team):

Any athlete who has been registered by the CFF to represent Canada in any weapon at any FIE International competition at the Cadet, Junior or Senior level **MUST**:

- Be physically present in the fencing competition area supporting the Canadian Team in that weapon during the Team competition day (regardless of whether the athlete is competing or not). No athlete is permitted to be absent from the Team event (regardless of whether he/she is competing or supporting) without being approved by the National Coach and HPD (in writing) 14 days prior to the event.
- Wear a CFF Team Canada tracksuit jacket for the team event (both for the athletes who are fencing and those supporting).
- For all senior world cup team events, be present at the team dinner the night before the team competition unless instructed otherwise by the Team Coach. This applies to all athletes entered in the individual event.
- Team Event: All fencers selected for a Junior World Cup Team event must be prepared to participate in the team event. The athletes competing in the team event will be selected by the project coach at the competition in consultation with the HPD and national team coaches and may not necessarily be the athletes entered on the FIE website list of entrants. The participating fencers will be responsible for paying the FIE team fees. The project coach at the competition will select fencers for the team event. If an athlete is unable to adhere to the above rules, they are requested to contact the National Coach and the HPD at least 14 days prior to the event. Each case will be reviewed and will be approved by the National Coach and the HPD on a case-by-case basis.

The following exemptions will be potentially granted by the HPD and National Coach:

- School exam - must have a letter on school letterhead from the instructor.
- Athlete injury during the individual event.
- Any other exceptional reason deemed valid by the National Coach and the HPD.

If an athlete fails to be present for the Team event (unless approved by the coach in charge of the team and HPD in writing), the HP Advisory Committee will impose appropriate consequences after consulting with the National Coach. These consequences may include, without being limited to, removal of HP points earned from that competition, removal of all international HP points gained from previous and current international events, or removal from the HP program.

10. HIGH PERFORMANCE PROGRAM SELECTION RANKINGS

The HPP Selection Rankings are used to identify athletes for international competition selections and for CFF funding opportunities. Athletes will be ranked by their total points in the designated selection competitions in the current season.

Ties in the senior HP rankings will be broken as follows:

- By the best result (as defined by HP points) in the designated international competitions. Should a tie still exist, the tie will be broken by the tie breaking procedure used for the Cadet and Junior World Championship described on page 9.

Only athletes who are registered in the High-Performance Program will appear in the HPP selection rankings.

11. 2027 CADET AND JUNIOR PAN AMERICAN ZONAL AND WORLD CHAMPIONSHIPS SELECTION CRITERIA

The CFF will select four (4) athletes per weapon and gender category for each of the Cadet and Junior Pan-American Championships and for Junior World Championships. For Cadet World Championships, three (3) athletes per weapon and gender category will be selected.

There are 2 qualification pathways for athletes to qualify for the 2027 Cadet and Junior Pan-American and World Championship teams.

Pathway 1 (2026 SENIOR World Championships SELECTION)– For Cadet and/or Junior fencers who were selected to represent Canada at the 2026 **SENIOR** World Championships for individual or team events based on meeting senior selection criteria. The athlete must have been **RANKED** in the top 4 of the High Performance Program **SENIOR** rankings and qualified for the 2026 **SENIOR** World Championships through HPP selection points and have achieved the selection criteria set forth in the Senior Team Selection Booklet (not by replacement pursuant to an injury or declined selection by another athlete).

Athletes who were selected for the Senior World Championships by virtue of ranking (ranked in the top 4 of the HP senior rankings) but declined due to injury, will also meet the criteria to qualify via pathway 1, provided that the injury was reported as required by the CFF Injury Policy (section 16 of this Booklet)

Athletes who are eligible for Pathway 1 **MUST** satisfy the criteria below to be selected to the 2027 Cadet and Junior Pan-American and World Championship team:

1. Attend every designated senior world cup competition (not Grand Prix events) in their weapon category prior to the selection date (February 23, 2027) for the Cadet and Junior World Championships. Athletes must also be available and present for every team event, whether selected to compete in the team event or not. Athletes may be excused attending a senior world cup competition if permitted by the national coach, HPD and CFF Executive Director provided a written request to do so is submitted at least 14 days prior to the competition. Approval can be granted for reasons that include, but are not limited to:

academic school commitments, NCAA athletic commitments, family emergencies or similar. The athlete must write an email to the national coach, HPD and ED no later than 14 days prior to the World Cup explaining why they need to miss a designated event.



2. Exceptions to the above criteria may be made in the event of injury to an athlete which prevented participation in the 2026 Senior world championships or in 2026/27 competitions as per the injury policy.(see section 16 of this Booklet).

The following athletes may be eligible for qualification pathway 1 in the 2026/27 season, subject to meeting the criteria above:

- Junior Men's Epee: Junzhe (Simon) Shan
- Junior Women's Epee: Ruien (Angel) Xiao, Julia Yin
- Junior Men's Foil: Borys Budovskyi
- Junior Women's Foil: Yunjia (Lucia) Zhang, Nadia Hayes
- Cadet Men's Epee: Junzhe (Simon) Shan

Athletes who are eligible for Pathway 1 AND who satisfy the above criteria will be ranked and selected before all other athletes on the Cadet and Junior High Performance (HP) point rankings, regardless of actual HP points.

Pathway 2 (HP POINTS) – Cadet and Junior fencers can qualify for the 2027 Cadet and Junior Pan American Zonal and World Championships Teams by earning High Performance (HP) points through designated competitions. The top ranked fencers on the Cadet and Junior HP rankings will be selected to 2027 teams after athletes who have qualified through Pathway 1 have been selected. Please refer to each weapon's Cadet and Junior National Team Selection Program Overview for how many competitions count for HP points and the accompanying list of designated competitions for the 2026-27 season. The selection date of February 28, 2027, will be the last day for earning HP points.

Tiebreaker for Cadet and Junior World Championships selection:

Should two (2) or more fencers be tied on the Junior HP rankings, the tie will be broken as follows:

- By the best result (as defined by HP points) among the designated international competitions.
- Should a tie still exist, the tie will be broken by the best result by position in the most recent result achieved by each athlete at a designated international (FIE) Senior competition.
- Should a tie still exist, the tie will be broken by the best result by position in the most recent result achieved by each athlete at a designated international (FIE) Junior competition.
- Should a tie still exist, the tie will be broken by the best result by position in the most recent result achieved by each athlete at a designated NAC Senior competition.
- Should a tie still exist, the tie will be broken by the best result by position in the most recent result achieved by each athlete at a designated NAC Junior competition.
- Should a tie still exist, the tie will be broken by the best result by position in the most recent result achieved by each athlete at a designated Canada Cup Senior competition.
- Should a tie still exist, the tie will be broken by the best result by position in the most recent result achieved by each athlete at a designated Canada Cup Junior competition.
- Should a tie still exist, the tie will be broken by the final Junior HP Ranking achieved in the 2025/6 season.

- For further clarity, “the best result by position in the most recent result achieved by each athlete” means the most recent result achieved by an athlete in the designated competition for their weapon closest to the selection date.



Should two (2) or more fencers be tied on the Cadet HP rankings, the tie will be broken as follows:

- By the best result (as defined by HP points) among the designated international competitions.
- Should a tie still exist, the tie will be broken by the best result by position in the most recent result achieved by each athlete at a designated international (FIE) Senior competition.
- Should a tie still exist, the tie will be broken by the best result by position in the most recent result achieved by each athlete at a designated international (FIE) Junior competition.
- Should a tie still exist, the tie will be broken by the best result by position in the most recent result achieved by each athlete at a designated NAC Senior competition.
- Should a tie still exist, the tie will be broken by the best result by position in the most recent result achieved by each athlete at a designated NAC Junior competition.
- Should a tie still exist, the tie will be broken by the best result by position in the most recent result achieved by each athlete at a designated NAC Cadet competition.
- Should a tie still exist, the tie will be broken by the best result by position in the most recent result achieved by each athlete at a designated Canada Cup Senior competition.
- Should a tie still exist, the tie will be broken by the best result by position in the most recent result achieved by each athlete at a designated Canada Cup Junior competition.
- Should a tie still exist, the tie will be broken by the best result by position in the most recent result achieved by each athlete at a designated Canada Cup Cadet competition.
- Should a tie still exist, the tie will be broken by the final Cadet HP Ranking achieved in the 2025/6 season.
- For further clarity, “the best result by position in the most recent result achieved by each athlete” means the most recent result achieved by an athlete in the designated competition for their weapon closest to the selection date.

12. CFF SELECTION APPEALS POLICY

13. SELECTION DATES

2027 CADET AND JUNIOR WORLD CHAMPIONSHIPS

- **Date:** March 31st – April 29th, 2027 (exact dates TBD)
- **Location:** TBD
- **Selection Date:** February 28th, 2027
- **Number of athletes:** 4 (Junior), 3 (Cadet)

ATHLETES SELECTED FOR CADET AND JUNIOR WORLD CHAMPIONSHIP TEAMS MUST FULFILL THE FOLLOWING REQUIREMENTS FOR THEIR SELECTION TO BE FINALIZED:

- Fencers are required to confirm their participation by replying to (hpc@fencing.ca) within 72 hours of receiving the selection e-mail. If a reply is not received in this time frame, it will be considered a refusal of the selection.
- Fencers must arrive and depart on the dates set by the High Performance Director and the National Coaches that are communicated in their selection email. Fencers will be invoiced for hotel costs based on these dates.
- All cadet and junior Canadian team fencers must stay in the hotel selected by the CFF. Exceptions must have approval in writing from the National Coach, the HPD, and the Executive Director before the event. Minor athletes may stay with parents or guardians.
- Payment for hotel costs and airport transfers must be completed by the date in the selection email. Selection to Cadet and Junior World Championship teams is conditional upon fulfilling the above criteria.



2027 CADET AND JUNIOR PAN AMERICAN ZONAL CHAMPIONSHIPS

- **Date: January 31st – February 13th , 2027 (exact dates TBD)**

- **Number of athletes: 4 (Junior), 4 (Cadet)**

ATHLETES SELECTED FOR CADET AND JUNIOR PAN AMERICAN ZONAL CHAMPIONSHIPS TEAMS MUST FULFILL THE FOLLOWING REQUIREMENTS FOR THEIR SELECTION TO BE FINALIZED:

- Fencers are required to confirm their participation by replying to hpc@fencing.ca within 72 hours of receiving the selection email. If a reply is not received in this time frame, it will be considered a refusal of the selection.
- Payment of the referee fee through the link on 2mev must be made by the date stated in the selection email.
- Payment for hotel costs and airport transfers must be completed by the date stated in the selection email.

14. NATIONAL TEAM SELECTION DESIGNATED COMPETITIONS



The designated competitions for each weapon and age category are shown below.

For all Cadet and Junior weapon categories the following results will apply to the final rankings used to select athletes for the Cadet and Junior world championships.

**World Cup results – Junior**
best 2 (of designated Junior World Cups)

Best 3 of competitions held before cut off date

For further clarification the best 5 of the following 7 NAC events will count for cadet points:

- 1 October NAC: Div 1, Cadet
- 2 November NAC: Div 1, Junior, Cadet
- 3 February NAC: Div 1, Junior

15. REGISTRATION AND SELECTION POLICIES FOR FIE AND EFC INTERNATIONAL COMPETITIONS

Only the CFF can register fencers for any FIE or EFC competitions. All requests for registration for FIE or EFC competitions must be made as indicated below.

1. Designated Cadet World Cups (FIE)
2. Designated Junior World Cups (FIE)
3. Designated Senior World Cups and Grand Prix events (FIE)
4. Non-designated Cadet World Cups (FIE)
5. Non-designated Junior World Cups (FIE)
6. Non-designated FIE Satellite World Cups (FIE)
7. Non-designated Cadet Circuit competitions (EFC)

1. DESIGNATED CADET WORLD CUPS (FIE)



All requests for registration for FIE competitions must be made through the 2mev portal before the posted entry deadline. Only the CFF can register fencers for Cadet World Cup competitions through the FIE website.

Entry Limitations: CFF will select a maximum of 12 fencers for each designated Cadet World Cup. A fee of \$350.00 will be charged to the athletes attending each designated Cadet World Cup. This fee helps defray the cost of sending 2 referees, as is mandated by the FIE for Cadet World Cups, or paying the FIE fines should Canada not send 2 referees.

Registration request deadline: 35 days (5 weeks) before the first day of competition of the designated Cadet World Cup. Requests must be made through the 2mev portal. The link is posted at www.fencing.ca. **Late registration requests will incur a \$100 late fee.**

Selection Policies: All selections for designated Cadet World Cups will be made using the following criteria:

1. The National Coach, in consultation with the HPD, will select a maximum of 12 fencers for each designated Cadet World Cup.
2. Only athletes listed on the High-Performance rankings for that weapon and age category are eligible for selection.
3. Athletes identified as Pathway 1 athletes in the current Selection Booklet will have priority over all other HP Program members only if they request registration on time.
4. All other athletes will be prioritized according to the Cadet HPP rankings as of the registration request deadline.

Withdrawals from FIE Competitions: Withdrawals must be received by the CFF by email at hpc@fencing.ca at least fourteen (14) days before the first day of the competition. No other method of withdrawal is accepted. Athletes who withdraw after the deadline or who do not show up at the competition will be invoiced for the Canadian equivalent of the 500.00 Euro fine assessed by the FIE to the CFF and will be suspended from any future competitions (including CFF domestic events) until the fine is paid. Exceptions to the payment of this fine will only be considered if the athlete is withdrawing due to a “force majeure” situation such as an injury or illness, which prevents the athlete from competing. This documentation must be accepted by the FIE for the fine to be revoked. Medical documentation from a doctor must accompany the withdrawal notice, which must be sent by email with the withdrawal request before the scheduled competition, or the fine will be imposed. This documentation must be accepted by the FIE for the fine to be revoked.

Only designated Cadet World Cups count for National Team selection for 2027 Cadet and Cadet World Championships and 2027 Cadet and Cadet Pan American Zonal Championships.

2. DESIGNATED JUNIOR WORLD CUPS (FIE)



All requests for registration for FIE competitions must be made through the 2mev portal before the posted entry deadline. Only the CFF can register fencers for Junior World Cup competitions.

Entry Limitations: CFF will select a maximum of 12 fencers for each designated Junior World Cup. A fee of \$350.00 will be charged to the athletes attending each designated Junior World Cup. This fee helps defray the cost of sending 2 referees, as is mandated by the FIE for Junior World Cups, or paying the FIE fines should Canada not send 2 referees.

Registration request deadline: 35 days (5 weeks) before the first day of competition of the designated Junior World Cup. Requests must be made through the 2mev portal. The link is posted at www.fencing.ca. **Late registration requests will incur a \$100 late fee.**

Selection Policies: All selections for designated Junior World Cups will be made using the following criteria:

1. The National Coach, in consultation with the HPD, will select a maximum of 12 fencers for each designated Junior World Cup.
2. Only athletes listed on the High Performance rankings for that weapon and age category are eligible for selection.
3. Athletes identified as Pathway 1 athletes in the current Selection Booklet will have priority over all other HPP athletes only if they request registration by the 35-day deadline.
4. All other athletes will be prioritized according to the Junior HPP rankings as of the registration request deadline.

Team Event: Fencers for the team event will be selected and notified by the National Coach. All fencers selected for the individual event must be prepared to participate in the team event. FIE team event entry fees must be paid by the participating fencers.

Withdrawals from FIE Competitions: Withdrawals must be received by the CFF by email at hpc@fencing.ca at least fourteen (14) days prior to the first day of the competition. No other method of withdrawal is accepted. Athletes who withdraw after the deadline or who do not show up at the competition will be invoiced for the Canadian equivalent of the 500.00 Euro fine assessed by the FIE to the CFF and will be suspended from any future competitions (including CFF domestic events) until the fine is paid. Exceptions to the payment of this fine will only be considered if the athlete is withdrawing due to a “force majeure” situation such as an injury or illness, which prevents the athlete from competing. Medical documentation from a doctor must accompany the withdrawal notice, which must be sent by email with the withdrawal request before the scheduled competition or the fine will be imposed. This documentation must be accepted by the FIE for the fine to be revoked.

Only designated Junior World Cups count for National Team selection for 2027 Cadet and Junior World Championships and 2027 Cadet and Junior Pan American Zonal Championships.

3. DESIGNATED SENIOR WORLD CUP AND GRAND PRIX EVENTS (FIE)



All requests for registration for FIE competitions must be made through the 2mev portal before the posted registration request deadline. Only the CFF can register fencers for Senior World Cup competitions and Grand Prix events.

Entry Limitations: The CFF will select the maximum number of fencers permitted by the FIE for each designated Senior World Cup and Grand Prix event.

Selection Policies: All selections for designated Senior World Cups and Grand Prix events will be made using the following criteria:

- The top eight (8) athletes (minimum of 1 FIE point) on the FIE Senior rankings for that weapon
- The top two (2) fencers on the HP Junior rankings not otherwise qualified
- Two (2) fencers on the HP rankings selected at the discretion of the High Performance Director, the Executive Director, and the National Coach.

NOTE: Should the FIE restrict entries to eight (8) athletes per World Cup or Grand Prix event, selections will be made as follows:

- The top five (5) athletes (minimum of 1 FIE point) on the FIE Senior rankings for that weapon.
- Three (3) athletes on the HP rankings selected at the discretion of the High Performance Director, the Executive Director, and the National Coach.

Team Event: All fencers selected for a designated Senior World Cup must be prepared to participate in the team event and abide by the terms of the **“CFF Expectations of Athletes at International Competitions”**. Fencers for the team event will be selected by the National coach. Fencers listed on the FIE registration page for a team event may not be the final team selected to fence the team event by the National Coach.

Withdrawals from FIE Competitions: Withdrawals must be received by the CFF by email at hpd@fencing.ca at least fourteen (14) days prior to the first day of the competition. No other method of withdrawal is accepted. Athletes who withdraw after the deadline or who do not show up at the competition will be invoiced for the Canadian equivalent of the 500.00 Euro fine assessed by the FIE to the CFF and will be suspended from any future competitions (including CFF domestic events) until the fine is paid. Exceptions to the payment of this fine will only be considered if the athlete is withdrawing due to a “force majeure” situation such as an injury or illness, which prevents the athlete from competing. Medical documentation from a doctor must accompany the withdrawal notice, which must be sent by email with the withdrawal request before the scheduled competition or the fine will be imposed. This documentation must be accepted by the FIE for the fine to be revoked.

Only designated Senior World Cups and Grand Prix events count for National Team selection for 2027 Cadet and Junior World Championships and 2027 Cadet and Junior Pan American Zonal Championships.

4. NON-DESIGNATED CADET WORLD CUP COMPETITIONS (FIE)



Only the CFF can register fencers for FIE competitions. All requests for registration for FIE non-designated Cadet World Cups must be made as indicated below.

Entry Limitations: CFF will select a maximum of 4 fencers for each non-designated Cadet World Cup. No referee will be required. Athletes are encouraged to enter non-designated Cadet World Cups for experience. No points will be awarded for results at non-designated Cadet World Cups. Non-designated Cadet World Cup results will not appear on the High Performance Program rankings.

Registration request deadline: 35 days before the first day of competition.

Entry Procedures: Athletes may request entry by email to internationalentries@fencing.ca

Selection Policies: All selections for non-designated Cadet World Cups will be made using the following criteria:

1. CFF will select a maximum of 4 fencers for each non-designated Cadet World Cup.
2. There are no CFF fees for members of the 2026-27 High Performance Program, but athletes are responsible for their own entry fees at the non-designated Cadet World Cup.
3. Athletes who are identified as Pathway 1 athletes in the current Selection Booklet will have priority over all other HP Program members **only if they request registration on time.**
4. All other athletes will be prioritized according to the current Cadet HPP rankings.

Withdrawals from an FIE Competition: Withdrawals must be received by the CFF by email at hpc@fencing.ca at least fourteen (14) days prior to the first day of the competition. No other method of withdrawal is accepted. Athletes withdrawing after the deadline or who do not show up at the competition will be invoiced for the Canadian equivalent of the 500.00 Euro fine assessed by the FIE to the CFF and will be suspended from any future competitions (including CFF domestic events) until the fine is paid. Only the CFF can register fencers for FIE competitions. All requests for registration for FIE non-designated Junior World Cups must be made as indicated below.

Entry Limitations: CFF will select a maximum of 4 fencers for each non-designated Junior World Cup. No referee will be required. Athletes are encouraged to enter non-designated Junior World Cups for experience. No points will be awarded for results at non-designated Junior World Cups.

Registration request deadline: 35 days before the first day of competition.

Entry Procedures: Athletes may request entry by email to internationalentries@fencing.ca

Selection Policies: All selections for non-designated Junior World Cups will be made using the following criteria:

1. CFF will select a maximum of 4 fencers for each non-designated Junior World Cup.
2. Only athletes listed on the High Performance rankings for that weapon and age category are eligible for selection. Athletes are responsible for their own entry fees at the non-designated Junior World Cup.
3. Athletes identified as Pathway 1 athletes in the current Selection Booklet will have priority over all other HP Program members **only if they request registration before the registration deadline.**
4. All other athletes will be prioritized according to the current Junior HPP rankings.

NOTE: Unless approved by the National Coach **in writing**, teams will NOT be entered in non-designated Junior World Cups. If approved by the National Coach, the fencers are responsible for payment to the CFF of the FIE referee fee (1000 Euros) in advance of the competition and are responsible for payment of the team entry fee at the non-designated Junior World Cup.

Withdrawals from an FIE Competition: Withdrawals must be received by the CFF by email at hpc@fencing.ca at least fourteen (14) days prior to the first day of the competition. No other method of withdrawal is accepted. Athletes withdrawing after the deadline or who do not show up at the competition will be invoiced for the Canadian equivalent of the 500.00 Euro fine assessed by the FIE to the CFF and will be suspended from any future competitions (including CFF domestic events) until the fine is paid. Exceptions to the payment of this fine will only be considered if the athlete is withdrawing due to a “force majeure” situation such as an injury or illness, which prevents the athlete from competing. Medical documentation from a doctor must accompany the withdrawal notice, which must be sent by email before the scheduled competition. This documentation must be accepted by the FIE for the fine to be revoked.

Non-designated Junior World Cups results will NOT count for HP points, nor will results appear on the HP Program rankings.

6. NON-DESIGNATED SATELLITE WORLD CUP COMPETITIONS (FIE)



Only the CFF can register fencers for FIE competitions. All requests for registration for FIE Satellite events must be made as indicated in the sections below.

Entry Limitations: CFF will select a maximum of 4 fencers for each non-designated FIE Satellite event. No referee will be required. Athletes are encouraged to enter FIE Satellite events for experience. No points will be awarded for results at Satellite events. Satellite event results will not appear on the High Performance Program rankings.

Registration request deadline: 35 days before the first day of competition.

Entry Procedures: Athletes may request entry by email to internationalentries@fencing.ca

Selection Policies: All selections for FIE Satellite events will be made using the following criteria:

1. CFF will select a maximum of 4 fencers for each non-designated FIE Satellite event.
2. Athletes who are members of the 2026-27 High Performance Program have priority over all other athletes requesting registration for non-designated FIE Satellite events. There are no registration fees for members of the 2026-27 High Performance Program.
3. Athletes will be prioritized according to the current Senior HPP rankings.
4. Space permitting, athletes who are not members of the 2026-27 High Performance Program may register upon payment of a \$250 registration fee for each event, in addition to purchasing an FIE license through the CFF.

Withdrawals from an FIE Competition: Withdrawals must be received by the CFF by email at hpc@fencing.ca at least fourteen (14) days prior to the first day of the competition. No other method of withdrawal is accepted. Athletes withdrawing after the deadline or who do not show up at the competition will be invoiced for the Canadian equivalent of the 500.00 Euro fine assessed by the FIE to the CFF and will be suspended from any future competitions (including CFF domestic events) until the fine is paid. Exceptions to the payment of this fine will only be considered if the athlete is withdrawing due to a “force majeure” situation such as an injury or illness, which prevents the athlete from competing. Medical documentation from a doctor must accompany the withdrawal notice, which must be sent by email before the scheduled competition. This documentation must be accepted by the FIE for the fine to be revoked.

Athletes should not make any travel arrangements until they have received an e-mail confirming that they are registered.

FIE Satellite events are non-designated and will NOT count for HP points, nor will results appear on the HP Program rankings.

7. NON-DESIGNATED EUROPEAN FENCING CONFEDERATION CADET CIRCUIT (EFC)



Only the CFF can register fencers for EFC competitions. All requests for registration for EFC Cadet events must be made as indicated in the sections below.

Entry Limitations: CFF will select a maximum of 3 fencers for each non-designated EFC Cadet event. No referee will be required. Athletes are encouraged to enter EFC Cadet events for experience.

Registration request deadline: 35 days before the first day of competition.

Entry Procedures: Athletes may request entry by email to internationalentries@fencing.ca

The CFF will select a maximum of 3 fencers for each EFC Cadet event. Fencers will receive email confirmation of registration.

Selection Policies: Selections for EFC Cadet events will be made using the following criteria:

1. Athletes who are members of the 2026-27 High Performance Program have priority over all other athletes requesting registration for non-designated EFC Cadet events. There are no registration fees for members of the 2026-27 High Performance Program. Athletes are responsible for their own entry fees to be paid at the event.
2. Athletes who are not members of the 2026-27 High Performance Program will pay a \$250 registration fee for each event and purchase an EFC license through the CFF.
3. Athletes will be prioritized according to the current Senior HPP rankings.
4. Late registrations may be permitted **IF SPACE ALLOWS** up to 14 days before the day of competition upon payment of a late fee of \$ 100 CAD.

NOTE: Unless approved by the National Coach **in writing**, teams will NOT be entered in EFC Cadet events. If approved by the National Coach, the fencers are responsible for payment to the CFF of the EFC referee fee (500 Euros) in advance of the competition and are responsible for payment of the team entry fee at the EFC Cadet event.

Withdrawals from an EFC Competition: Withdrawals must be received by the CFF by email at hpc@fencing.ca at least fourteen (14) days prior to the first day of the competition. No other method of withdrawal is accepted. Athletes withdrawing after the deadline or who do not show up at the competition will be invoiced for the Canadian equivalent of the 500.00 Euro fine assessed by the EFC to the CFF. Athletes will be suspended from any future competitions (including CFF domestic events) until the fine is paid. Exceptions to the payment of this fine will only be considered if the athlete is withdrawing due to a “force majeure” situation such as an injury or illness, which prevents the athlete from competing. Medical documentation from a doctor must accompany the withdrawal notice, which must be sent by email before the scheduled competition. This documentation must be accepted by the EFC for the fine to be revoked.

Athletes should not make any travel arrangements until they have received an e-mail confirming that they are registered.

EFC Cadet events are non-designated and will NOT count for Team Selection points, nor will they appear on the HP Program Rankings.

SENIOR WORLD CUPS AND GRAND PRIX EVENTS HELD IN CANADA

NORTH AMERICAN CUPS (USA FENCING)

North American Cups (Cadet, Junior, and Div I NAC's) are organized by USA Fencing (USFA) and are designated as international selection competitions for the CFF HPP Selection Rankings.

Important: Only results in ELITE category cadet, junior, and Division I NAC's will count for CFF High Performance Program Selection points

Selection: Fencers must purchase a foreign fencer membership with USFA and comply with USA Fencing rules. Foreign fencer licenses are available through this link: [USA Fencing Memberships](#)

2. SELECTION PROVISION FOLLOWING DOCUMENTED INJURY / ILLNESS



The National Coach, in collaboration with the HPD, may select for the National Team or for a competition, an athlete who has been injured or ill during a part of the season, regardless of ranking, if within seven (7) days of the injury or illness, and before an absence in competition, the athlete submitted to the CFF a report of injury accompanied by a recovery plan. The athlete must have been a member of the National Team in that category in the previous two seasons.

3. SAFE SPORT

All athletes, parents of athletes under the age of 18, and coaches traveling to an event or taking part in the team's activities, are required to complete the Coaching Association of Canada Safe Sport training module, or the applicable program from Respect in Sport, complete the **NEW** [Canadian Safe Sport Program \(CSSP\) education module and consent](#) form, and to familiarize themselves with the information on the Safe Sport page of the CFF website, including the CFF's Safe Sport Policy Manual.

(example: 1st place at a Junior World Cup is 4,000; it will be 2,000).
- At any **World Cup – Cadet, Junior or Senior** – which has 128 fencers or less, the points will be worth **75%** of its value
(example: 1st place at a Junior World Cup is 4,000; it will be 3,000).
